A ZINE (pronounced “zeen,” as in magazine) is a simple DIY self-published booklet. Zines can be made at home, inexpensively, with simple materials that you may already have lying around. A sheet of paper, some folding and a snip. Zines can house stories, essays, poems, or anthologies... but they can also include drawings, collage, comics, or photographs. And they are ideal for homemade holiday gifts! So what does that mean for storytellers?

This Workshop is taught by Eli Martel, an experienced storyteller and the winner of the 2020 Washington State Zinemaking Contest

- ◆ Use as brainstorming tool to identify and develop stories to share with an audience.
- ◆ Illustrate simple stories. Great handouts at storytelling events.
- ◆ Turn your work into something tangible outside the constraints of the publishing industry
- ◆ Zines will be right at home on any merchandise table or website
- ◆ Give out pocket-sized zines with your business card to help folks remember what you tell
- ◆ Swap zines by mail as another way to share stories
- ◆ You can increase your reach to a completely new audience by tabling at ‘zinefests
